
this solemn day by remembering the ultimate sacrifice made by so many for this country is truly unforgettable.



Every need is unique, and Giving Grace is there to meet people where they are. Now it's our turn to give back!



It's so important!" immediately Sandy spearheaded a plan to record John's presentation so that it could be used in schools and in other clubs and with the youth of the Rotary Interact Clubs. With the help of Senator Albers staff and videographer Tran Smith and a team from Roswell Rotary, the video was recorded and is now being shared with so many citizens.
